Hit and Run Kills Resident on Stringfellow Road North

Motorcycle Accident Results in Two Deaths

Approximately 7:00 am Friday, April 13, two Pine Island residents, Chad Oake, 25, of Cape Coral,



and passenger Beth Nielson, 21, were in a fatal motorcycle accident hitting a car head-on at the west end of Matlacha on the curve. They were returning to the island and were killed instantly. The 2-lane road was blocked for about 3 hours waiting for the arrival of the coroner.

Police investigators said the motorcycle was passing a car around the curve at over 70 mph when it collided with a '94 Camero. The driver of the Camero, Martha Brown, 70, suffered minor injuries and left the hospital that day, the Camero's front-end was severely crushed in.

a chance to comment on some of these issue and any new ideals they may have. Each question offered five answers (Strongly Agree, Agree, Neutral, Disagree, Strongly Disagree) and you were asked to indicate only one answer and comment in writing.

Mr. Spikowski said there was some discussion about types of businesses and the design of commercial buildings. Like other areas in Lee County, businesses are an essential part of our community's character. They provide useful services and employment to some of the residents. Most businesses on Pine Island only employ a few people, maybe 1-5-employee per business. This requires most residents to leave the island to go to and come from work causing much of the road congestion.

Fencing and walls were discussed as they serve many purposes; depending on their placement, design and construction. If done right they can enhance the community, but suggested that there is no place on Pine Island for large security gates and perimeter concrete walls. Mr. Spikowski adjourned the meeting.

During the past fourteen months, the Greater Pine Island Civic Association has been coordinating a comprehensive review of Lee County's plans and development rules for Pine Island. An initial public presentation on this plan was held in February. This second session updated Pine Islanders on the most recent progress on this plan, including new ideas on rural land uses, the design of commercial buildings, Pine Island's bike path, historic buildings, fences & walls. At this session the public will have a chance to comment publicly on these ideas or respond to a written questionnaire.
